Hello Everyone,

I pray that this finds you well. I for one am glad March is here. February was just a roller coaster ride with the weather, let's hope that ends soon. All of March this year is within the season of Lent and this year instead of giving up something for Lent I am going to attempt to learn. I am not taking any classes instead I am going to read and recently I purchased two books and have a third on my shelf already that I am reading through Lent.

One of the books I just bought is written by a funeral director named Caleb Wilde. The title is "All the Ways Our Dead Still Speak: A Funeral Director on Life, Death, and the Hereafter." Like our own Paul Saether, the author is a multigenerational funeral director in a small town. He just happens to be in Pennsylvania. Through his stories he attempts to show how love and memory and mystery fuse this world to the next. One of the many privileges of being your pastor is that I am allowed to walk with you on the holy ground between life and death when a loved one has died. My hope is to learn how to better walk this path with you.


The next book is called "Search" This book should be pure pleasure as it is written through the eyes of someone who is on the pastoral search committee. It is satirical and funny and told as a memoir through church recipes as this fictional Universal Unitarian church in California embarks on a search for a new pastor. As you know this is hard, frustrating work and it will be enjoyable to see the humorous side of this important work.

The last book I have chosen has been on my shelf for a while and it is time to read it. The title is "Rabbi Jesus: An intimate biography." It is written by a Professor of Religion and an ordained priest. He writes the story of Jesus through the context of First century Judea. It is another way to enter into the gospel stories in a unique way. My goal is to learn how the environment he grew up in both the political and social along with the religious might have played a role in his ministry. This is a work of fiction and as such any claims that are made need to be taken with a grain of salt and measured against the truth of the gospels.

This is my reading plan for Lent. What have you thought about learning or setting aside for this season of Lent? This is the season of preparation, for me a season to be a better pastor. A time to better prepare myself to meet you at the cross and guide you to the empty tomb.

Engaging Generosity

Have you ever wondered why we call money, currency? It comes from a Latin word that literally means "flowing." It is the same word were we get the word current from. Like anything with a current it is meant to move. When you dam up a river what happens? The water can become stagnant, a breeding ground for mosquitoes, algae, weeds, it can begin to stink. When electricity stops flowing, what happens? Nothing runs. The same thing can happen with money.

Your giving not only helps to keep the lights on, keep the electricity flowing, or pay the Pastor's salary, it also is a place where those in need receive help. Your gift to the church aids in many different ministries and also flows out to the greater church to touch people you will never meet but who give thanks for your generosity.



Board of Trustees minutes from 2-13-2023 meeting

Present: Pastor Chris, Rodney Kurschner, Dan Hittensdorf, Jay Massey Visitors: VP Chuck Meyer, Treasurer Becky Johnson • Welcomed Jay to the board.

- Voted Rodney Kurschner to the position of Chairperson.
- Shared the bylaws with everyone and went over the responsibilities according to the bylaws.
- We discussed wooden signs at the entrance to the village of Blanchardville.
 - The sign on Hwy 78 coming from Argyle is leaning and needs to be resupported.
- Discussed the options for the heating loop in the parament room. Considering rerouting the water pipe to prevent freeze ups.
- Welcomed the visitors to the meeting to discuss the building insurance options. Current policy year ends on February 17. We had two quotes on the table: one from our current insurance company, Acuity, with quotes for two different deductibles. The other from Hastings.
