God's peace be with you, Pastor Chris







# BECAUSE OF GOD'S GREAT MERCY



a stewardship program for our congregation

"Because of God's Great Mercy" is the title of our stewardship emphasis this year. The scriptural basis of this focus on our stewardship of all that God has entrusted into our care is I Peter 2:9, "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness and into his marvelous light."

We begin by proclaiming all that God has done for us, hence the title "Because of God's Great Mercy." God has made us God's own people. We will also consider how generous giving is an important part of every Christian's life, and how our combined generosity can make even greater things possible through our congregation.

We will think together about how our giving to New Hope is an important part of our Christian faith, and how New Hope uses our offerings to do God's work within the congregation's walls, in our community, and around the world.

"Because of God's Great Mercy" will ask you to do two things. First, you will be asked to increase your giving to New Hope by at least ½ of 1% of your household income. Second, you will be asked to consider giving electronically either through Tithe.ly or through your bank by using an EFT.


"Because of God's Great Mercy" will use mail, e-mail, and time in worship to share information with you. Please make a special effort to watch for material during this important time in our congregation's life.



- Becky Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Becky, Pastor Chris, Chuck Meyer, Judy Watrud, Jay Massey, Neal Klassy, and Michele Kittleson. As there wasn't a quorum, no business could be approved.
- Pastor Chris lead us in devotions based on a reading from 2nd Timothy.
- Approval of the minutes of the September meeting was tabled until November.
- Becky gave the treasurer's report. A member gave an offering specifically to Portico of \$1000. Another member gave a no interest loan of \$9000 so the amount owed to Portico is current. She also stated that our payment to the Synod is behind three months.
- There were no comments on the Board reports.
- Pastor reported that there are eleven students in confirmation. They went to Dodgeville for an event on food scarcity. In November they will be working in Mission Central one week. December will be helping pack Cheer boxes and a field trip to Temple Beth El in Madison.
- He is planning on a Stewardship program for the month of November. There will be email and snail mail letters to all members with a start date of November 9. Commitment cards will be collected on November 30.
- There was no correspondence, no transfers and no visitors attending the meeting.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Due to lack of a quorum the Lefse Sale Profit Donation was tabled to November.
- The Congregational Meeting will be at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, December 14 at Blanchardville.
- The agenda will be election of Council members; approval of the 2026 Budget and finding delegates to the Synod Assembly.
- Shannon Marion will be guest speaker on November 23.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- Positions to be filled on Council are President, Vice President, 2 Deacons, 1 Trustee and 2 Board of Education members.
- Changes to the Mission and Vision Statement was tabled for lack of quorum.
- Capitol Projects Report: Pastor said one of the new boilers isn't working correctly. The Company they were purchased from is ordering parts at no charge.
- Chuck reported that Kevin Erickson will be finishing painting. The final detail is the push bar which is still not in. He will continue to look for someone to do the tuck pointing next summer.

The next meeting will be November 17th which is the 3rd Monday. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
